Corporate Dash for a Difference

On October 4, 2019 nearly 200 volunteers from businesses throughout Hartford participated in a Dash for a Difference, an innovative community service initiative to foster team building and explore Hartford's historical and cultural gems through a friendly corporate competition. Sponsored by Prudential Financial, in partnership with Hands On Hartford, Dash for a Difference offers a mix of experiences to both celebrate Hartford and engage with the city's diverse populations. Service opportunities included:

- Outdoor work at neighborhood parks
- Participating in classroom activities with schoolchildren
- Serving lunch to seniors
- Creating toiletry kits for several basic needs organizations
- Painting at an after school youth program and senior living facility

The winning team, a group from Aetna, then chose one of the non-profit stops, Burgdorf Community Garden, to receive a \$500 award.

Faith In Action

Our Community Engagement team organized an interfaith volunteer event for youth, sponsored by the Muslim Coalition and the Connecticut Conference United Church of Christ. The youth collected 356 pounds of food, and \$116 at Stop and Shop. While at the store students took turns doing a SNAP challenge, planning a week's meals on a budget of \$31.50. After the food drive they came back to Hands On Hartford, unloaded and weighed the food and had a discussion about the food drive experience. They capped off the day with a Faces of Homelessness Speakers' Bureau presentation,. The students said the entire event was inspiring, educational, and fun, and they want to do it again.





A youth group from Immanuel Congregational Church in Hartford did an immersion project with our Community Engagement team, painting herb pots for our Sprouts for Kids initiative, and volunteering at the Daybreak adult day care center playing bingo, making bead jewelry and serving lunch. We're so impressed with their kindness, love and care for the community.
