Backpack Nutrition Program - An Impactful School Year

8 Hartford schools and 237 students served each week - another successful school year of our Backpack Nutrition Program is coming to a close. With the pandemic impacting school schedules, the backpack program has been making deliveries of backpacks full of food to schools twice a week for the last year.



Britt'ny Bettis-Allen, the HOH coordinator of the backpack program, stated that "the pandemic created a lot of challenges for this program, but for us to be able to still have served as many families as we did throughout the school year has been amazing!"

The students have shown their appreciation for the program by telling their teachers and school backpack coordinators how helpful the program has been for their families. The students at one school even show their excitement for "backpack day" by placing sticky notes on their school coordinator's door each week to tell them how excited they are for their backpacks.

Not only are the students and their families appreciative of this program, but the schools are as well, continuously expressing their gratitude for the difference the Backpack Nutrition Program has made for their students.

The week of June 7th will be the final week of the school year for the backpack program, and will wrap up a challenging but highly impactful year. We are so grateful for all of the incredible volunteers whose hard work made this possible!





Story from the "Simple Sunday Supper" Group

Jane Lennox, a member of the Friends of Hands On Hartford Group, made a donation towards a van for our new Homeless Outreach Program and shared how this donation came about. For the last 40 years, 4 couples have had a dinner group known as "SSS"-Simple Sunday Supper, where each couple takes turns hosting. Each time the couples gather, they put money into the "SSS Fund" and when enough has been accumulated, they typically go out to a nice restaurant.

Last fall, the Fund had reached the "going out" point but the pandemic was at the "staying home" point, so the group decided to use the money to bid on a catered dinner in Hands On Hartford's Hands & Hearts Together



Auction. They won a dinner catered by Chef Meghan Montana, but decided to wait until everyone was vaccinated to get together, which happened in April. That night, Jane shared about the outreach program, the hygiene kits, and the need for a van and it was unanimously agreed that the SSS Fund should go toward the van.
