In honor of Indigenous People's Day last month, our Food Access Specialist, Danielle, highlighted a special dish for our collection of "Pantry-Inspired Meals". Utilizing items featured in our MANNA Community Pantry, Danielle put together "Three Sisters Stew", highlighting three native ingredients. A combination of butternut squash, corn, and beans were incorporated. These foods have been cultivated by Indigenous peoples as part of their diets for thousands of years. Onions, chopped zucchini, and carrots can also be added, all of which are food items currently featured in our Pantry!


